

Youth Protection Champion

Last 90 days:

- As of September 16th, the District is at 99.64% of its leaders being YPT trained. The affected Scouters were sent emails on the 17th to alert them to their status.

 Updated Guide to Safe Scouting and Barriers to Abuse
- Two registered adult leaders, age 21 or older, are required at all Scouting activities, including all meetings.
- There must be a registered female adult leader 21 years of age or over in every unit serving females. A registered female adult leader 21 years of age or over must be present for ALL activity involving female youth.
- Cub Scout parents or legal guardians taking part in an overnight Cub Scout program with their own child or legal ward are not required to register as leaders; however the parent or legal guardian must be accompanied by a registered leader at any time they are supervising youth members other than their own child/ward.
- Even with minimum leader requirements, program-appropriate supervision must always be provided.
