


2024 Solar Eclipse – Earn the Patch!

- 1. Locate a site suitable for viewing the eclipse. NASA's official site, which lists all the major cities over which the eclipse will cross, with the exact times that Scouts and families need to be ready. 8 April 2024
- 2. Describe how to safely view the eclipse. It is not safe to look directly at the sun without specialized eye protection for solar viewing. This includes looking at it through binoculars, a telescope or your phone's camera. Solar viewing glasses are thousands of times darker than regular sunglasses. Look for solar viewing glasses that comply with the ISO 12312-2 International standard. You can also safely view an eclipse using an indirect viewing method, such as Scout Life's shoebox viewer.
- 3. Discuss with your group what you saw and felt during the eclipse. A total solar eclipse happens when the moon passes between the sun and Earth. Depending on how close you are to the path of totality, you may see the sky darken considerably. Depending on the weather, you could see stars, as if it were nighttime. In some instances, night creatures might even come out. Up to 84% coverage in Western NC.
- 4. Do the following:
- Cub Scouts: Discuss what a solar eclipse is with your leaders.
- Scouts BSA members: Draw a diagram of the positions of the moon, Earth and sun to show how the solar eclipse occurs
- Venturers and Sea Scouts: Research Sir Arthur Stanley Eddington's 1919 experiment and discuss how it confirmed Einstein's theory of general relativity.




NASA how to track eclipse







Occoneechee Council Registration Changes

Occoneechee Council Executive Board voted to increase our Council Fee by \$14 for youth and adult registered members to help underwrite the increasing cost associated with program and service delivery.

Therefore, effective August 1, 2024, youth fees will increase from \$66 to \$80 and adults from \$12 to \$26.

The fee structure is:

- \$165 per Youth Member
 \$85 National BSA Fee goes to the National Council
 \$80 stays local in the Occoneechee Council
- \$91 per registered Adult Member
 \$65 National BSA Fee goes to the National Council
 \$26 stays local





Safe Scouting – April 2024

Hazard Trees

According to the U.S. Forest Service, America's forests are in decline with broken or hanging limbs, root rot, insect infestations, lightning, wind events and abundant moisture leading to the creation of abnormally high numbers of "hazard trees." Hazard trees include dead trees, live trees with dead parts, and live trees that are unstable due to defects and are within striking distance of people or property, which may affect unit camping or other outdoor activities. A study published in 2008 found that 407 people were killed by "wind-related tree failures" in the U.S. between 1995 and 2007. In 2020, there were just over 16,000 reports of thunderstorm high winds or thunderstorm wind damage in the U.S., according to NOAA's Storm Prediction Center, in general, winds over 60 mph, which are common in severe thunderstorms, tropical storms, hurricanes and nor easters, are capable of downing trees.

Here are some tips to prevent a hazard tree from affecting your event:

- •Assess your site. Look up, look down, and look all around when parking a vehicle, hiking on the trail, or selecting a campsite.
- •Avoid campsites with hazard trees. Dead trees and dead limbs may fall at any time. Trees without needles, bark, or limbs may indicate structural defects.
